What is a Special Interest Group?

Our 2:15 p.m. programs every Thursday are Special Interest Programs because they are focused on specific topics or computer applications. Special Interest Groups (SIGs) are a subset of the LSCS membership that has a special interest in applying computers to a unique requirement or area of interest (Article IV, Section 5, Item L, SIG Leaders and SIGs, Page 4 of our By-laws).

What is the Society's SIG Policy?

Continuing from the By-laws:

- The Society shall support and/or sponsor SIG programs and meetings.
- SIGs are to be formally approved by the Executive Committee as are their Leaders, who when approved shall have the authority to attend and participate in the affairs of the Executive Committee.
- SIG Leaders are to develop and conduct the monthly programs of their respective SIGs and should keep the Executive Committee informed of SIGs plans and activities.

How SIGS are Formed; Who May do It?

- A SIG may be formed by any number of members who wish to come together to focus on some special area of computer activity and application under the auspices of the LSCS.
- Usually one member serves as the SIG Leader; however, other forms of leadership may also be employed.

How Can You Become a SIG Member?

- Simply by attending and participating at SIG Meetings.
- You do not need to register but some SIG Leaders use a sign-up list.
- There are no additional fees associated with any of our SIGs.
